

AP English Language and Composition / AP English III Summer Reading Assignment 2022 - 2023

Rationale: The summer assignment provides students the opportunity to explore rhetoric and argumentation by surveying the Colonial and Founding periods of American history. This assignment will expose you to the level of reading and writing you are expected to complete in the course.

Required Text for Assignment: *Founding Brothers: The Revolutionary Generation* by Joseph J. Ellis. You can find it on Amazon at <http://tiny.conroeisd.net/V3KVw>. You will need this text for some time into the 1st 9 weeks, so just checking it out might not be best.

Assignment Directions: Read the *Founding Brothers* preface (“The Generation”), which will help provide some context. Then read the rest of the book and address the prompt below for each of the six chapters. You should write this in MLA essay format. Each essay should be approximately one to one-and-a-half pages typed (double-spaced, Times New Roman, 12 pt font) for a total of six to ten pages.

For each chapter, discuss the following:

- What is the main argument being presented?
- Who are the parties involved?
- In what ways are these people attempting to convey their message or purpose?
- How does the argument conclude?

In addition, write an introductory paragraph and a concluding paragraph that considers the overarching argument for the book as a whole.

Due Date and Submission: The assignment will be due at the beginning of the third week of school. It must be typed so that you can submit to our plagiarism checker--so be sure that all work is independent and original.

Cheating / Plagiarism: Plagiarism, the act of taking credit for the work or ideas of someone else, will not be tolerated. Whenever you are asked to write in this course, it is under the expectation that the work you do is your own. This particular assignment is based entirely upon what you read in the book and no other sources should be used. You should quote and paraphrase *Founding Brothers*, but use of any other materials will result in a 0 as well as a referral to the administration for academic dishonesty. Please note that our plagiarism checker automatically checks your submission for plagiarism against all published materials, websites, and other assignments submitted through the site (such as your friends who have a different teacher).
