

GOHS Parking

Frequently Asked Questions



Q: What do I need to do to get a parking permit?

A: Register online and take quiz, pay \$75.00 fee, bring in copy of driver's license, receipt and insurance card WITH student's name on it to the Assistant Principal in charge of parking.

Q: What if I forgot my permit at home or I am driving my parent's car?

A: Let the Assistant Principal in charge of parking know as soon as you get on campus. ALL vehicles are required to have a tag displayed on the front rear view mirror at all times.

Q: What if someone is parked in my spot?

A: Write down the car's license number, park in visitor section (front of school) and report it to Prevention Control Officer or AP office immediately. DO NOT park in someone else's spot.

Q: What if I lose my parking permit?

A: See the Finance Secretary in the front office and pay \$10.00 replacement fee. Show copy of receipt to the Assistant Principal in charge of parking and a replacement tag will be issued.

Q: Can I share my tag with my friend since they are driving me now?

A: No, students are not permitted to share tags unless they registered to do so. Using someone else's tag could result in loss of parking privilege.

Q: Do I have to register a new car after I have a parking space?

A: Yes, any vehicle parking on GOHS must be registered. All information must be updated to the Assistant Principal in charge of parking. All registered vehicles must be listed on proof of insurance card. Get form from the AP's office to update information.

Q: Can I have my parking suspended or revoked? Will I get a refund?

A: Yes, you can. Tardies, moving violations, unregistered vehicles, and unauthorized use of personal vehicle during school hours are just a few ways you can have parking suspended or revoked. See Student Handbook for complete list. NO refunds will be given for suspensions or revocations.

Q: Does registering for a parking space ensure I get one?

A: No, registering for a parking space does not guarantee that a parking space will be issued. Parking spaces will be given in order of priority beginning with Seniors, then Juniors. If there are additional spaces available Sophomores may be given the opportunity to register. Failure to complete registration or failure to produce a valid driver's license, insurance card with student name on it and receipt of payment will cause students to be moved to a waiting list.

Q: Can students hang out around cars in the morning or after school?

A: No, students are not allowed to loiter either in their cars or in the parking lot at any time. When students arrive on campus they are expected to exit their vehicle and enter the school building.
