

# 2024 PROM DRESS CODE



Prom is a very special event for our seniors, so students are encouraged to dress accordingly.

Appropriate prom attire may be classified as a dress, tuxedo, dress suit, (including a tie or bow tie), a dress shirt (which may include a vest), and dress shoes.

We hope to maintain the integrity and formality of this night by implementing the following dress code expectations and suggestions:

- If you have questions concerning the outfit you'd like to wear to prom, please see an administrator
- It is your responsibility to seek prior approval from a Grand Oaks administrator regarding any dress items that may violate the prom dress code
- For those wearing suits, jackets and ties are encouraged, but not required
- Dresses may be strapless (if they fit properly) or include spaghetti straps
- Dresses may be backless, as long as they are not cut below the natural waist
- 2-piece dresses may only show a modest amount of midriff
- Short dresses must not be higher than 4 inches above the knee (i.e. midthigh)
- This includes any dresses with sheer/mesh bottoms, and bi-level dresses
- Long or mid-length dresses may not have a slit higher than mid-thigh
- Dresses may not be cut below the bust line in front
- Dresses cannot have cuts or slits in them that expose undergarments, or the skin typically found underneath undergarments
- Sheer or see-through apparel should not expose undergarments, or the skin typically found underneath
- Undergarments should not be visible
- Flip-flops or slides are not permitted
- Casual hats and head coverings (baseball caps, etc.) are not permitted
- Non-formal headwear is not allowed (ex. baseball style caps, bonnets, bandanas, etc.)
- Costumes, masks, party accessories, and sunglasses are not allowed
- If you are bringing a date, it is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to ensure your guest is aware of the dress code for prom
- Students and guests not appropriately dressed will be turned away at the door
- Students who paid their senior dues (the Blue Package ONLY) may begin picking up their prom guest forms from Mrs. Zamora in the downstairs AP office (1206)
